Home Maintenance Checklist for Insurance Approval

Stay ahead of issues and improve your insurability with this seasonal maintenance guide.

Roof & Exterior
[] Inspect and repair roof (replace damaged/missing shingles)
[] Clean gutters and downspouts
[] Check and seal roof flashing, vents, chimneys
[] Trim tree branches near the home and roof
[] Power wash or clean siding
[] Check and repair fences, gates, and handrails
[] Repair cracked sidewalks or driveways
[] Inspect windows and doors for leaks or damage
Plumbing & Electrical
[] Check for leaks under sinks and around visible plumbing
[] Inspect water heater and pipes
[] Update old electrical panels or wiring if needed
[] Test all GFCI outlets and circuit breakers
[] Install or check smoke detectors & carbon monoxide detector
Yard & Landscaping
[] Clear dry brush, leaves, and debris
[] Keep grass trimmed and landscaping tidy
[] Ensure grading slopes away from foundation
[] Keep shrubs and trees at least 3 ft from house and roof
Heating & Cooling
[] Service HVAC system (clean filters, inspect ducts)
[] Replace aging furnaces or heating systems if needed
[] Test thermostat functionality
[] Check attic ventilation
Safety & Security
[] Test smoke & carbon monoxide detectors
[] Check outdoor lighting around entryways
[] Secure windows and doors (locks, seals)
[] Consider installing or updating home security system

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Foundation & General

[] Inspect foundation for visible cracks or water intrusion
[] Test sump pump (if applicable)
[] Check attic and basement for leaks or moisture
[] Document all repairs/upgrades (save receipts and take photos)

Pro Tips

- Keep a folder or digital record of home maintenance receipts
- Take yearly photos of key home systems (roof, HVAC, plumbing)
- Update your insurance agent on any major renovations or upgrades

Tip: Review this checklist twice a year - spring and fall are ideal times!
